Students Drill: Facing an unforeseen terrorist attack on school

A drill on **How to Tackle a Terrorist Attack** was conducted on 12 February, by Maj Paul Joseph, an alumnus of Army Public School, Dhaula Kuan. He is a trained Black Cat Commando and is posted at NSG Manesar. The school had organized a drill for the teachers, staff, and students of class VI-VIII, on the 12 February 2024 in the school assembly ground. Maj Paul had taken the session and guided the students on how to face an unforeseen event of a terrorist attack on the school. The students and staff members were guided on how to counter any sort of terrorist invasion in the school premises. This guidance was conveyed through methods that were not only easily understood by students but also demonstrated in practical terms.

An easy to remember **3 Step Action Plan** was discussed with the students along with separate instructions for the teachers and staff as well. This activity not only helped the students understand the ground reality in such a situation but also prepared them to act cautiously.





The 3 Step Action Plan was instructed as follows:

RUN:

- 1. Running to a safe place to hide from the eyes of the invader/terrorist and which would protect you from gunshots. Preferably indoors.
- 2. Run in the opposite direction from the place where you can hear the gunshots.
- 3. Avoid running in the open areas like ground.
- 4. DO NOT run towards large rooms like auditorium, halls, etc. as the invaders can easily hold you a hostage and many others in a large room
- 5. If someone gives you any bag or object to handle DO NOT open it or do anything with it.

HIDE:

- 1. Find a place to hide from the sight of the attacker which can also protect you from gunshots.
- 2. Use desk, chairs, tables, or any heavy furniture available in the room to block the doors.
- 3. Put your Mobile Phones on Silent but DO NOT switch them off as it can be the only medium of contact for you and others with you.
- 4. Be smart to analyse and hide in a place where no one can see you.

FIGHT:

- 1. This should be your LAST OPTION when you cannot run or hide anywhere.
- 2. Decide sensibly which available item around you or with you can help you unarm the attacker. (Ropes/stone/clothes, bag, etc)
- 3. Be cautious of protecting yourselves and others.

BENEFITS:

- You can limit the terrorists and save lives if handled sensibly.
- Limit the casualties.
- Identity the attackers and help the authorities.
- Provide important information to the authorities.
