

REPUBLIC DAY SPECIAL (2022)

India on Jan 26, 2022 celebrated 73rd Republic Day under the broader ambit of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. 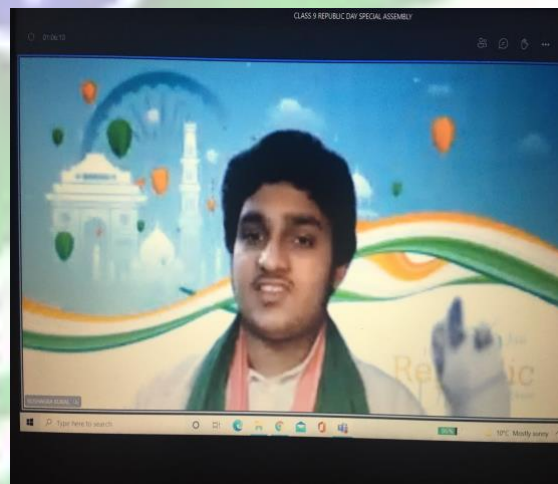

Freedom in Mind, Faith in Words, Pride in our Heart, Memories in our Souls.

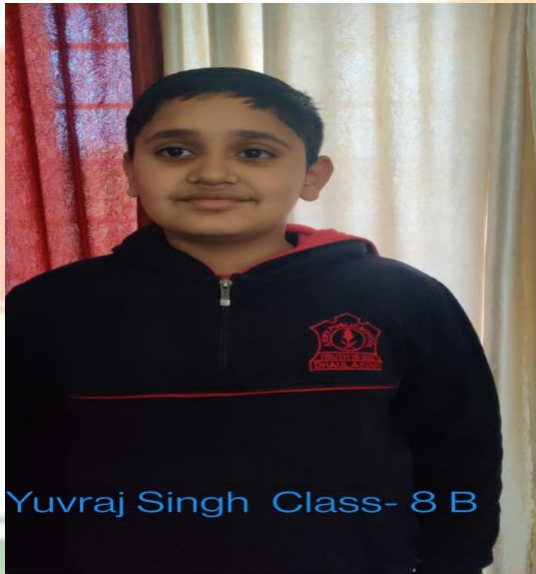

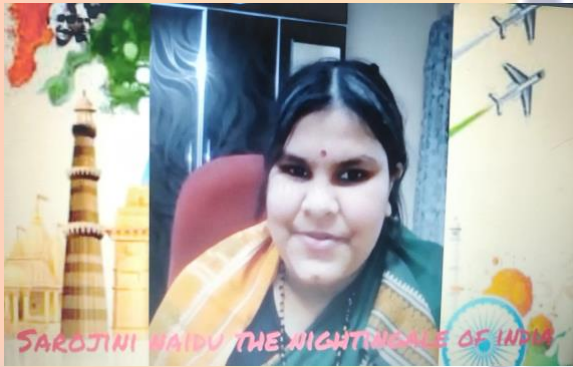

Art& Craft products out of waste for Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav

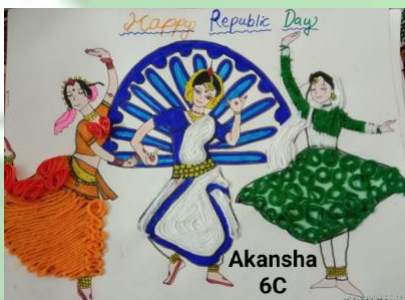
