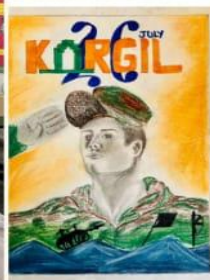
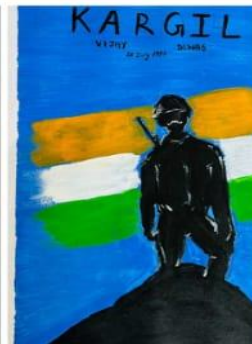
There was enthusiastic participation from all the four houses. Students were given 50 minutes to finish their posters. All the participants turned in some really fine work.

#### A VISIT TO THYAGRAJ STADIUM, NEW DELHI

***“IT CANNOT BE RIGHT TO MANUFACTURE A BILLION OF OBJECTS THAT ARE USED FOR A MATTER OF MINUTES AND THEN ARE WITH US FOR CENTURIES”***



Students and teachers of Army Public School , Dhaula Kuan , New Delhi are welcome to read this write up on the visit to Thyagraj Stadium ,New Delhi by the students of class 10<sup>th</sup> on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022 .

In our way to 21<sup>st</sup> century the increasing uses of single use plastics is having a great impact on the lives of humans and the other organisms present worldwide. Few days back a survey was conducted which found that humans are having micro-plastics inside their bodies and a cow was found with 71 kgs of plastics inside its stomach. We all are aware of the fact that plastics are non-biodegradable i.e. it takes hundreds of years to decompose and hence it leaves a great effect on the soil. In our country India, thousands of companies produce single use plastic which once used is thrown away. Single use plastic is one of the most prevalent cause of pollution. It has a devastating impact on oceans, sea animals and hydrophytes.

It was a mind full of memories. **It was a three days fair organised for phasing out of Single Use Plastics by the Department of Environment, GNCTD.** In this fair there were many start-ups/ entrepreneurs/ SHGs/ traders /manufactures etc who came out with their stalls with the products that can replace plastics. Many replacement materials for thermocol like plates, glasses, cutleries made with sugarcane residues (**bagasse**) could be seen. Water bottles made with clay, biodegradable packaging materials that could replace bubble packs, jute and canvas bags etc were on display.

It was a wonderful experience and we came to know about many more new things which weren't explored by us before. We hope the alternatives that we came across are going to change our life.

Today our government is also focusing on 17-Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to protect our environment for better present and future living standard. For achieving these goals we the people of India have to unite to support our government for its implementation from grass root level. Further it is not a national issue but a global phenomenon and every year on 5th June the World Environment Day is being celebrated across the globe.

To protect our nation and seeing the future damage that can be caused the government has taken a huge step by banning 19 plastics items which includes plastic straws, disposable cutlery, ear buds, candy and ice cream packaging, and cigarette packets etc. We should spread maximum awareness for its implementation so that we can together make a better environment with a better future.

A three-day mega fair 'Plastic Vikalp mela' was organized by the Delhi government from July 1 to July 3, 2022, in Thyagaraj Stadium, Delhi, to create awareness of the single-use plastic ban and promoting its alternatives as the country banned 19 types of plastics which can't be recycled and harm the environment. The chief guest of the event was Gopal Rai, Environment minister, Government of Delhi.

The fair included stalls of entrepreneurs as well as school/college students which exhibited products made from recycled or waste products such as plastic wrappers and paper. Society for Child Development Organization, Enactus, Power Delhi, Mitticool Pvt Ltd, Eco Bramrin India Pvt Ltd, Arts Prem, KleenCup, Why Waste Wednesday, Jeevika SHG, Prajapati SHG and Indian Pollution Control Association and many more big societies were a part of the fair. Many of these organizations and groups involve the underprivileged sections of society such as women from rural areas, underprivileged transgender communities, and disabled persons, in the process of production.
